Minutes of April 2nd 2024 Meeting

Meeting was held at the Falcon Police Station, 7850 Goddard St., Colorado Springs. 16 member clubs and one guest, Tom Divine of Southern Colorado NSRA, were signed in. Officers present were President Dick Thompson, 2nd Vice President Calvin Craig, Secretary Dick Fritz, and Treasurer Samantha Baker. Since less than a quorum were present, this was an information meeting (no resolutions).

Legislation: Our lobbyist, Leo Boyle, was unable to attend as he had to be at another meeting in Denver. John Mack passed on information from Leo that House Bill 24-1380 dealing with issuance of oil & gas drilling has been killed but four other bills (House and Senate) concerning the ozone air quality problem have yet to be heard in committees. We recognize that amendments threatening use of vehicles can be added even at the last few days of the 2024 legislative session which ends in May.

Minutes for the March meeting were accepted as published.

Treasurer's Report: Samantha Baker summarized the balances in the Operating, Government Relations, and Car Show & Swap Meet accounts. The report was approved unanimously.

Renewal Status and club membership numbers: The CCCC Bylaws in article III state that a member club must have 10 members. At the present time, several clubs have dropped below that number and will have to be considered inactive and ineligible to vote or be listed on the web site.
